Greetings and Welcome,

Jeevandeep Shaikshanik Sanstha, Poi is registered in the year 1990 by a devoted teacher and social worker Shri. Ravindra Narayan Ghodvinde, to bring the stream of higher education in Kalyan rural area, Which covers around 65 villages. Till the first higher education Institute, named Arts, Commerce and Science College Goveli is established in the year 2004 this area was cut-off from the spring of higher education. Leave aside girls higher education, even male children were deprived off, from the road of higher education because of absence of HEI, in this economically and socially backward region. To resolve this pinching problem, Shri. Ravindra N. Ghodvinde stepped forward and established the first HEI under the name of Arts, Commerce and Science College, Goveli in Kalyan rural area. By maintaining the same tempo, he formed 9 more higher educational (Including Law, Management Colleges) Institutes , apart from Primary and Secondary Schools and Junior Colleges which are spread over Kalyan, Murbad and Shahapur Talukas. The trust is running vacation training center of new based courses in tribal area of Khardi, Goveli and Mhasa. The College has introduced new job oriented and professional Courses to suit the need of this area. The college has got Permanent Approved for University of Mumbai. This college has secured NAAC 'B' grade in 2nd Cycle, and has got 2f and 12B Certificate from UGC. College runs both traditional and professional courses from UG to PG for 3800 students of this area and female student constitute 50% of the total students population. Students of our college, have secured many National and International medals in different sports. So far 62 gold and silver medals are won by our students in national and international sports 102 students of our college have been employed in state, central and private Organization from the sports Quota. In cultural activities our 6 students secured gold & silver medals at National level. Our college students 'Kumar Tushar Sirsat 'has represented India in musical competition conducted in Mareshiya and won silver medal The college has conducted many social work activities which include Tree Plantation, River cleaning Gram swachhata bhiyan, blood donation camp, Health check -up camps and many more social activities. our management staff and other concerned class are bent for social and economies upliftment of this rural area and to make it ideal location of the state.

MAIN FEATURES OF ASSESSMENT OF 2026 - 27

1. Physics Chemistry & Biology will be for 100 marks - 70 for written and 30 marks for practical exams (30 marks - practical exam. Project and information collection)
2. In case of maths and IT 100 marks will be classified into 80 & 20 (80 marks for written and 20 for practical exams.)
3. Having one question paper for (Physics, Chemistry Biology) will be given 70 marks with 3hr. duration for written exam Question papers will be divided into two separate sections having 35 marks for each section.
4. In case of physics and chemistry both sections should be written on the same answer paper.
5. For Biology separate answer papers will be provided for both sections. (Botany & Zoology)
6. For maths & statistics one question paper will be given having 80 marks with 3 hr. duration.
7. For XI / XII Arts, Commerce Marks are classified into 80 & 20, for all subject (80 marks for written exam & 20 marks for oral exam / project work).

GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSIONS

Junior College

● As per the Government Decision Dated 25 Feb 2025 , all Admissions for 11th Std. will be online from the academic year 2026-2027. admission class 12th std, will be offline as per the prevailing system

Admission Guidelines - XI & XII Classes :-

1. A student who has passed SSC (Std X) examination by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary & Higher Secondary Education or any other recognized as equivalent Board is eligible for admission for the Std XI Class.
2. The college will admit a student, who has passed an examination other than, that conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary & Higher secondary Education, provisionally such students may contact the college office immediately after taking admission, for guidance in securing Eligibility Migration confirmation from the HSC Board.
3. Students who are seeking admission in XI Arts / Science / Commerce are required to note that admission is as per merit, that Merit is based on the aggregate / parentage marks scored at the qualifying and that the seats are reserved for different categories of students, as follows.

2. Credit Framework under Three/Four-Years UG Programme with Multiple Entry and Multiple Exit options:

The structure of the Three/Four-year bachelor's degree programme allows the opportunity to the students to experience the full range of holistic and multidisciplinary education in addition to a focus on the chosen major and minors as per their choices and the feasibility of exploring learning in different institutions. The minimum and maximum credit structure for different levels under the Three/Four year UG Programme with multiple entry and multiple exit option are as given below:

3. Distribution of Credits across Four Years Degree Programmes:

In general, for the four years' bachelor's degree programme, the distribution of credits will be as follows:

(a) Major (Core) Subject comprising Mandatory and Elective Courses:

- i) Minimum 50% of total credits corresponding to Three/Four-year UG Degree-Mandatory Courses offered in all Four years;
- ii) 2 credit course on Major Specific IKS shall be included under Major;
- iii) Elective courses of Major will be offered in the third and/or final year.
- iv) Vocational Skill Courses, Internship/ Apprenticeship, Field Projects, Research Projects connected to Major.

(b) Minor Subject: 18-20 Credits

- i) The Minor subjects may be from the different disciplines of the same faculty of DSC Major (Core) or they can be from different faculty altogether.
- ii) The credits of Minor subjects shall be completed in the first three years of UG Programme.

(c) Generic/ Open Elective Courses (OE): 10-12 credits

- i) It is to be offered in I and/or II year
- ii) Faculty-wise baskets of OE shall be prepared by University/Autonomous Colleges.
- iii) OE is to be chosen compulsorily from faculty other than that of the Major.

(d) Vocational and Skill Enhancement Courses (VSEC): 14-16 credits

Vocational Skill Courses (VSC): 8-10 credits, including Hands on Training corresponding to the Major and/or Minor Subject:

- i) To be offered in first three years;
- ii) Wherever applicable vocational courses will include skills based on advanced laboratory practical's of Major.

Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): 06 credits

- i) To be offered in I and II year;
- ii) To be selected from the basket of Skill Courses approved by University/ Autonomous Colleges.

(e) Ability Enhancement Course (AEC), Indian Knowledge, System (IKS) and Value Education Courses (VEC) : 14 Credits.

AEC : 08 credits

- i) To be offered in I and II year
- ii) English: 04 Credits
- iii) Modern Indian Language: 04 credits
- iv) To be offered from the Basket approved by University Autonomous Colleges

The focus for both languages should be on linguistic and communication skills.

IKS: 2 Credits

- i) To be offered in I Year.
- ii) Courses on IKS to be selected from the basket of IKS courses approved by University/ Autonomous Colleges Credits.

VEC: 04 Credits

- i) To be offered in I year.
- ii) Value Education Courses (VEC) such as Understanding India, Environmental Science/Education, and Digital and Technological Solutions.

(f) Field Projects/ Internship/ Apprenticeship/ Community Engagement and Service corresponding to the Major (Core) Subject, Co-curricular Courses (CC) and Research Project.

- ❖ Internship/Apprenticeship corresponding to the Major (Core) Subject: 8 Credits.
- ❖ Field Projects/Community Engagement and Service corresponding to the Major (Core) Subject: minimum 4-6 credits
 - To be offered in II, and III years of UG Degree Programmes.
- ❖ Co-curricular Courses (CC) such as Health and Wellness, Yoga education sports, and fitness, Cultural Activities, NSS/NCC and Fine/ Applied/ Visual/ Performing Arts: 8 credits
 - To be offered in I and/or II year
 - Research Projects: 12 credits
 - To be offered in the final year for 4 year Honours with Research UG Degree

The UGC Regulations, 2021 permit up to 40% of the total courses being offered in a particular programme in a semester through the Online Learning Courses offered through SWAYAM platform and/or other State Level Common Platform which can be developed in due course with the participation of different Universities/HEIs

ELIGIBILITY RULES FOR UG

-: B.Sc. Chemistry :-

Eligibility for admission to B.Sc. Degree Courses with Mathematics/ Physics/ Chemistry/ Botany / Zoology / Geography / Home Science (Main) shall be a pass on the Higher Secondary, Intermediate, or Senior Secondary School Certificate Examination offering the relevant disciplines. Candidates applying for admission to B.Sc.(Chemistry) should have passed their qualifying examination with Mathematics, Physics & Chemistry.

-: B.Sc. IT/ Data Science :-

- a) A candidate for being eligible for admission to the degree course of Bachelor of Science- Information Technology, shall have passed XII standard examination of the Maharashtra Board of Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent with Mathematics and Statistics as one of the subject and should have secured not less than 45% marks in aggregate for open category and 40% marks in aggregate in case of reserved category candidates.
- b) Candidate who have passed Diploma (Three years after S.S.C. XTH Std.) in Information Technology / Computer Technology / Computer Engineering / Computer Science / Electrical, Electronics and Video Engineering and Allied Branches / Mechanical and Allied Branches / Civil and Allied branches are eligible for direct admission to the second year of the B.Sc. (I.T.) degree. However, the Diploma should be recognized by the Board of Technical Education or any other recognized Government Body. Minimum marks required 45% aggregate for open category candidates and 40% aggregate for reserved category candidates.

OR

Candidates with post HSC — diploma in information Technology / Computer Technology / Computer Engineering / Computer Science and Allied branches will be eligible for direct admission to the Second Year of B.Sc. (I.T)

However, the Diploma should be recognized by the Board of Technical Education or any other recognized Government Body. Minimum marks required 45% aggregate for open category candidates and 40% aggregate for reserved category candidates.

Admission will be on merit, based on order of preference as follows:

1. Marks in Mathematics and Statistics at H.S.C. or equivalent.
2. Aggregate Marks H.S.C. XII (Std. XII) or equivalent.
3. Aggregate Marks S.S.C. (Std. X)

-: T. Y. B.Sc. MATHEMATICS :-

Mathematics At 12th Science F.Y. B.Sc & SN. B.sc. (Hons.) Mathematics or Bachelor of Science (Honors) in Mathematics is an undergraduate Mathematics course. Mathematics is the study of quantity, structure, space, and change. B.Sc. (Hons.) Mathematics program provides in-depth knowledge about geometry, trigonometry, calculus and various other theories in Mathematics or related disciplines, such as computer science or statistics in addition to study of the normal Bachelor of Science subjects like Physics and Chemistry. The duration of the course is three years and the syllabus for the course is divided into six semesters. This Mathematics Honors course is an important and valuable one that provide opportunities to the candidates of after taking some of the subjects of Master's degree. After completing the course they can go for many fields to obtain jobs. The course is being offered by many colleges/ universities in off and on campuses throughout the country.

:- B.M.S / BAF Eligibility :-

: 0.3941 Amended as per Cir. No. UG/278/07

A candidate for being eligible for admission to the B.M.S. Degree Course shall have passed XII Std. Examination of the Maharashtra Board of Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent examination or Diploma In any Engineering branches with two years of three years or four years duration after S.S.C. , conducted by the Board of Technical Education, Maharashtra State or its equivalent examination ..by securing minimum 45% marks for general category (in one attempt at the respective Examination & minimum 40% marks for the reserved category (in one attempt)

No college shall conduct any entrance test in any form and be admissions are purely based on merit duly following the reservation policy as per the norms of Government of Maharashtra . While drawing the merit list, weight age has to be given to students from Arts, Commerce and Science Stream at 12th Standard level. The stream wise weightage to be given is as under:-

No college shall conduct any entrance test in any form and be admissions are purely based on merit duly following the reservation policy as per the norms of Government of Maharashtra While drawing the merit weightage has to be given to students from Arts, Commerce and Science Stream at 12 Standard level. LIBRARY

JSSP CENTRAL LIBRARY

Jeevandeep College of Arts, Commerce & Science College, Govell has established in the year 2004. College is situated In rural area of Kalyan, Dist. Thane. The institute has central and departmental libraries. The central library procured 331 books at the beginning of the college. Presently the library has more than 23565 books in general, more than 3464 books under the Book Bank Scheme, 50 Bound Volume of Journals; 21 periodicals, 8 Newspapers, 7 Maps, 15 CD's and DVDs etc. Library has also subscribed N-LIST Online Journals consortia. Library uses SOUL automation software since Dec.2016 from INFLIBNET. All software modules are run successfully i.e. Acquisition, Cataloging, Circulation, Serial Control, Administration and OPAC. All data entry newly purchased books and subscribed periodicals are entered in regularly.

In the library OPAC and Web-OPAC both are used by all students and staff. Web OPAC is accessed in only local access or intranet. But in future web OPAC of library will be linked on Internet via college website. The strength of any library lies in its library and information center. Bearing this in mind, the institution has provided great attention to the library.

Today college has a library with total built up area of 14445 sq.ft. with a 80 seated reading room and 8 seated e-resource at a time. This is on of the biggest library in a remote area like this. It is continuously developing.

There are many books like Encyclopedia, Dictionaries, Biographical Books, Journal's bound volume, Competitive Examination related, Old Question Papers, News Paper Clippings, etc.

Library is automated with the help of SOUL 3.0 library software. Central Library is a part of the institute. The library is connected to the BSNL's Broad Band Internet bandwidth. The library has 1 server, 14 PCs and other accessories adequate to cater to the needs of users. 13 PCs are for home lending section in the library. 1 PC is meant for users to access OPAC, databases, e-books, e-journals and other e-resources. Also library provide a reprographic service to the user in Rs.1/page

SCHOLARSHIP AND FREESHIP

As our college is unaided the source of funds for the college is through scholarships and freeships received from state Government every year. The students belonging to reserved category (SC/ST/SBC/OBC /NT) are required to submit application forms on-line before the dates declared by the Govt. All reserved category students have to open a bank account in their name and provide details to the college. Normally the dead line for submission of application forms is 8.5 per declared by Govt. The amount of maintenance allowance is directly credited in the student's account in bank of students getting scholarship.. There is no maintenance allowance for students getting freeship . The students belonging to (OBC/ SBC/NT) category get maintenance allowance the maximum limit of the income of The (OBC/ SBC/NT) students with Non Creamy Layer certificate has been fixed of Rs. 8 lakh for freeship.

- ♦ For BMS & CS. I.T. students : OBC/SBC/NT students don't get scholarship & freeship however, SC & ST students get full scholarship & freeship.
- ♦ For SC/ST students, the income limit for scholarship is 2.5 lakh per year. Above 2.5 lakh, there is freeship.
- ♦ Open category students are required to pay full amount of tuition fees. We allow installment facility for payment of fees to the college.
- ♦ The Reserved category students not filling up scholarship forms have to pay full course fee to the college.
- ♦ The college provides financial Assistance to the needy students (whose financial condition is weak) with the help of ONGC, HPCL & other NGO.
- ♦ College has its own scholarship named as 'Jevanjyot' for help of scholar & needy students.
